ECTS available	Yes, though sometimes converted from SWS (Semester Weekly hours) or LP (effort points).
Language requirements	Proficiency in German at least on level A2.2 of CEFR within the application deadline - a certificate at B1 level or higher must be provided before the semester starts.
Language certificate required	We require from all applicants who will attend courses an official language certificate for German or English (only for thesis, special programs, study fields offered in English).
Preparatory language courses for incoming students	Pre-semester German intensive language courses at ZEMS (Zentraleinrichtung Moderne Sprachen) - from level B1 and higher - <u>admission through a test</u> . The course fee is 275 Euro for a four weeks course - 80 hours. Winter semester course 2019/20: 02 th September - 2 nd October, 2019 Summer semester course 2020: 4 th March - 3 rd April, 2020 ZEMS-Website: <u>www.zems.tu-berlin.de</u>
Housing assistance	The International Office can only offer a very small number of dormitory rooms. Information will be provided after the acceptance.

	Public transportation: approximately 260 Euros ("Semesterticket") payable once for the entire semester

Health insurance/other insurances	Health Insurance
	Students with a valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) do not need an extra insurance. Those without will need to either be registered with a German health insurance company or need to check if their own private insurance is sufficient upon arrival in Berlin.
	Third Party Liability Insurance
	It is the responsibility of the student to take out insurance (from home) for personal belongings, accidents and third party liability while studying in Germany. TU Berlin does not cover any losses that may occur.
Additional fees to pay	If staying in a dormitory, students are required to pay a deposit of one and half months' rent.
Student jobs available/allowed	It is difficult to find a student job in Berlin and foreign students cannot base their finances on the chance of getting a job.
VISA	The sending and receiving institutions will provide assistance, if required in securing visas for incoming and outbound mobile participants, according to the requirements of the ERASMUS Charter for Higher Education www.betreuung-int-stud.tu-berlin.de
